The owners of Alex's Dry Cleaning and Shoe Repair, Alex and Irina Ginsburg emigrated from Russia to the American Midwest in the early 1980s with their five year-old daughter. Both parents were in their mid-twenties. Alex worked at an auto repair shop, while Irina studied English. After several months, Irina began working the night shift at a bedding factory.

Four years later, Alex purchased his first shoe repair business in Kansas City, Missouri. A couple of years later, now a family of four, they moved to Kansas City. A year later, they had their third child. Irina, now more proficient in

the English language, was now able to utilize her Russian Masters Degree in Biochemistry by working at a community blood bank as a lab technologist.

In 1989, the Ginsburg family wanted to move east to be closer to relatives. Alex came to Maryland to begin his new business venture, while Irina stayed behind in Kansas City to sell the family home. The family was reunited in the summer of that year and the couple purchased Torro's Shoe Repair located in the Aspen Hill area of Silver Spring.

Alex ran the business the past 16 years until this summer when he bought F & F Valet and merged it into Alex's Dry Cleaning and Shoe Repair in Wheaton. The Ginsburgs, now a family with five children are prepared to devote the time, effort and work, and with the support of their family, friends, as well as their established customer base and their new Wheaton community are looking forward to expand their new business.

County Council President Thomas E. Perez Asking Residents for Their Thoughts on Fiscal 2007.

In a letter to constituents, Perez (D-Dist. 5) of Takoma Park solicited comments for a Sept. 13 hearing, at 7:30 PM. in the Council Office Building, 100 Maryland Ave., Rockville.

On Oct. 1, the council plans to set budget priorities for the 2007 budget year, which begins July 1, 2006.

The fiscal 2006 spending plan stressed tax relief, education, public safety, affordable housing, health and human services, infrastructure maintenance, and the environment, Perez wrote in his letter.

The letter asks whether residents agree with those priorities, whether they should be ranked differently and whether others should be considered.
